

The pick and mix revision cards have been split into topics to make them easier to search, but you can mix and match across the topics (or add your own cards) to create your own set.

### Ideas for use

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#### 1. Independent revision

Students could be encouraged to annotate and colour code cards, or add their own cards to the set to create revision material useful to them.

#### 2. Collect to win game

Play in groups of three to five. Shuffle the cards and place them face down in the centre of the table. One player takes a card and reads the question to the person on their left. If they answer correctly, they keep the card. If they answer incorrectly, the question is offered to the next person round the table.

If no one can answer correctly, the answer is read out and the card is placed at the bottom of the pile to be tried again later.

The player to the left of the question-reader now takes a question and asks the player on their left. Play continues until all cards have been collected. The player with the most cards wins.

#### 3. Game boards

### Storing the cards

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This net, when assembled from card, makes an excellent storage box for the revision cards. The sides of the box cover up the answers but leave the question exposed.

You could ask students to create their own net and/or decorate the box.
